Summer Reading Assignment Grades 6-8 Summer 2024

This summer we ask that you choose one novel from the corresponding list of books and complete a "Book Review." You will be expected to type this assignment and submit a hardcopy to your Language Arts teacher on Monday, September 19, 2024. Email/online submissions will not be accepted.

This project will count as your first Reading Test/Project for the first marking period, so give it your very best effort.

Requirements:

Full name, Grade at the top of your document
Each answer should be a minimum of 4-5 sentences per paragraph, in two paragraphs.
12 font, Times New Roman
You do not need to retype the questions, but all answers must be numbered.

- 1. What is your general impression of the novel as a whole?
- 2. Who did you feel was the most developed character, aside from the protagonist?
- 3. Which character did you feel there was little to no information given? Who did you want to know more about?
- 4. What do you feel was one of the most important scenes in the book?
- 5. Which event(s) did you feel were unimportant? Or which event did you feel did not make sense with the story?
- 6. What would you have changed in the story?
- 7. What would you want in a possible sequel for the novel?
- 8. Which character did you relate to the most? Why?
